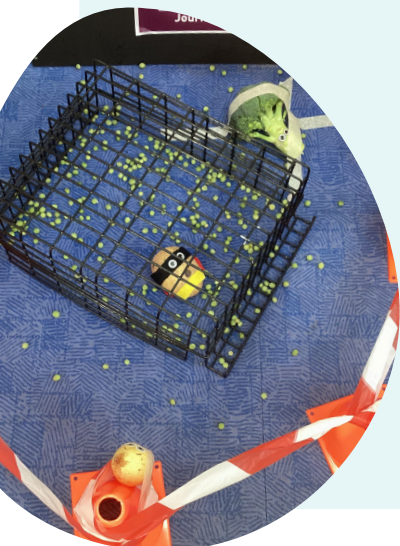
Class 1A & 1M

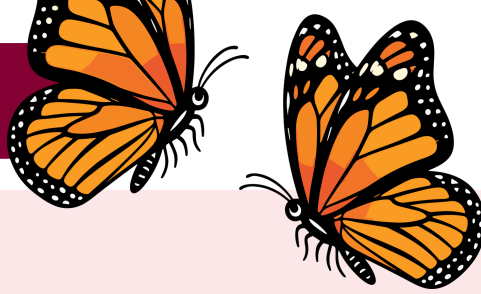
Welcome back Year 1! What a great first week back we've had! Everyone looked well rested and ready to get straight into learning.

Class 2CM & 2S

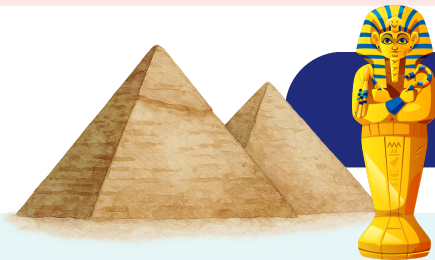
What a fantastic first week back! Year 2 have returned to their school routines with positive attitudes and lovely enthusiasm, well done all!

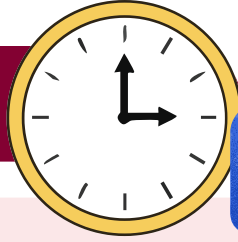
In reading, we are beginning our class text, Charlotte's Web. We are very excited to dive into the story, especially as many of the children are already familiar with the film.

Class 4GR & 4SR

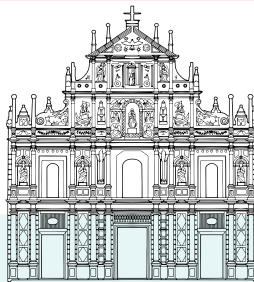
Welcome back Year 4! We have had a super first week back and the children all seem very pleased with their new uniforms!

In Writing, we are looking at warning stories, where someone is warned not to do something, but doesn't follow the instructions. We are looking at including speech within our work.

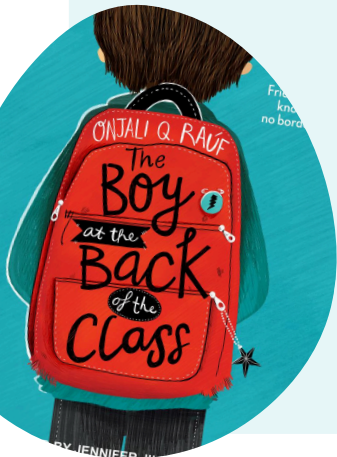
In Maths, we are learning about perimeter of shapes, including how to find a missing length.

We used Lux metres to measure the amount of light that travelled through certain objects in Science and used this to compare and group them using a key.

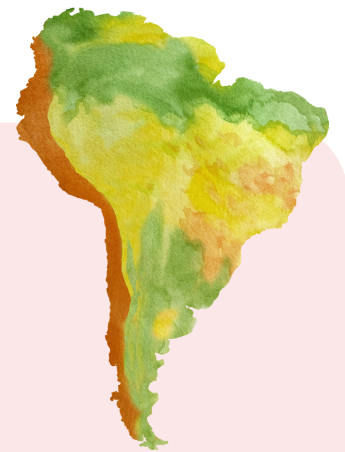
Our new Reading strategy book is *'The Boy at the Back of the class.'* We have made predictions about what we think will happen in the story!

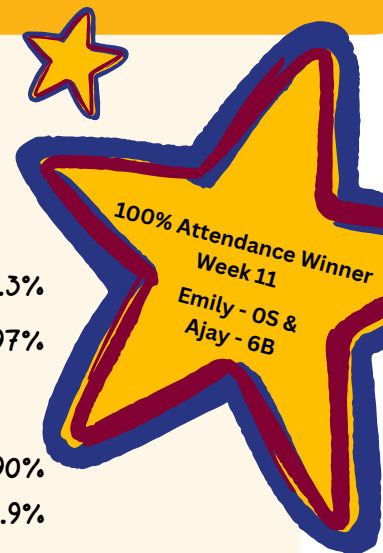

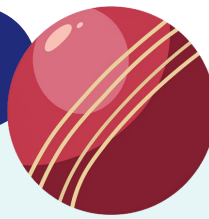
