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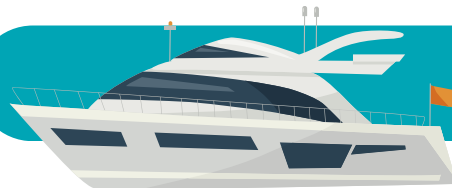
Class OE & OS

We have had a wonderful week in EYFS. The children have learnt all about remembrance day and why we reflect on it. The children participated in 2 minutes silence then did some wonderful Poppy printing pictures.

We have also looked at our new artist Andy Goldsworthy and how he creates art work using natural resources. The children then created their own art work using natural resources we collected from around school.

The children have made a wonderful start to the nativity practice.

Phonics sounds this week- sh, th, ng, nk. A polite reminder to make sure all phonics books are returned weekly to ensure enough for all pupils.



Year 1

Class 1A & 1TM

This week has seen us continue our learning about how transport has changed over time. We have looked at how the boat has changed and couldn't believe the oldest boat that has been found is 8000 years old!

In Design Technology we learnt about axles. We made an axle using dowel, plasticine, cardboard wheels and cotton reels. We found out that if the axle isn't in the middle of the wheel then we will have a wobbly wheel! In a few weeks we will use this skill to make a moving vehicle. If you have any small boxes please can you send them in (Yorkshire Tea sized boxes are perfect!).

In maths we have introduced subtraction. We practiced this skill by crossing out and using a number line.





Class 2CM & 2S

We have had a wonderful week in Year 2!

In PE, we enjoyed expressing ourselves and creating movements to show how plants grow.

In RE, we learnt that Advent means “coming” and talked about all the special things Christians do during this time.

In History, we loved learning about how the Great Fire of London started, and we had great fun doing some role play to show the timeline of events as they unfolded.

In Design and Technology, the children learnt about what an architect and a construction worker do. They also discovered that the famous architect Sir Christopher Wren designed St Paul's Cathedral after the Great Fire of London. The children then became construction workers themselves, following an architect's drawing to create a model using 3D shapes.



Year 3

Class 3M & 3S

Another busy week in year 3. We have been learning about using repeated addition to multiply numbers and about the commutative law e.g $3 \times 6 = 6 \times 3$.

In writing this week we have continued to work on our explanation text. It has been amazing to see the children's ideas on their chosen ideas.

In RE this half term we have been focusing on how Judaism links to Christianity and looked at the story of 'David and Goliath'. In history we have been looking at iron age roundhouses.

The children loved their first music lesson this week. It was great to see so many wonderful singers in year 3.





Class 4GR & 4SR

This week, in Maths, we have started looking at informal and formal methods to multiply a single digit by a 2 digit number e.g. 3×37 .

We have used Diene's equipment and drawn the numbers too.

In Writing, we have planned and written our 'hot write', which is a newspaper report linked to our strategy read, The Iron Man, where the space-bat-angel-dragon lands on Australia. Watch out Fleet St, there are some budding journalists among our Year 4s!

In our Reading, we are almost at the end of the story and this week have been left wondering whether or not The Iron Man or the space-bat-angel-dragon will prevail! Watch this space!

In Music, we are enjoying singing in rounds and were very impressed that we could manage one in 3 parts!

Our PSHE learning has been about stereotypes and what influences our opinions on different things.

Class 5BW & 5S

We observed 2 minutes silence on Tuesday as we thought about the symbolism of poppies and why we wear them.

This week we have continued with our writing about whacky inventions. We looked at Wallace and Gromit's Turbo Diner and Wonka's Chocolate Machine for inspiration. We recapped on what fronted adverbials were and included them in our writing. Next week, we start our Hot Write about our own crazy inventions. We can't wait to see what the children come up with!

In Maths this week, we have been looking at multiplying a 2 digit number with a 2 digit number. It has been a bit tricky but we are so pleased at how everyone has persevered. Maybe you could practise some at home?

Mountains have been our topic in Geography. Did you know that there are 5 types of mountains? I wonder if the children could tell you how some mountains are made.

Class 6B & 60

What an amazing week we have had in year six! The children have been fascinated by our Geography, discovering how Antarctica has changed in the last hundred years and how melting ice may impact future sea levels.

Our current writing unit will finish this week, we have been describing the planet of Pandora, the creatures that may live there and their diet! The variety of vocabulary from the children has amazed us including words such as bioluminescent, hibernation, hypnotising and behemoth!

We have also investigated, in our science lessons how our heart rates and blood oxygen levels change after exercise. We have completed a variety of exercises to compare them and see which one increases our heart rates the most!

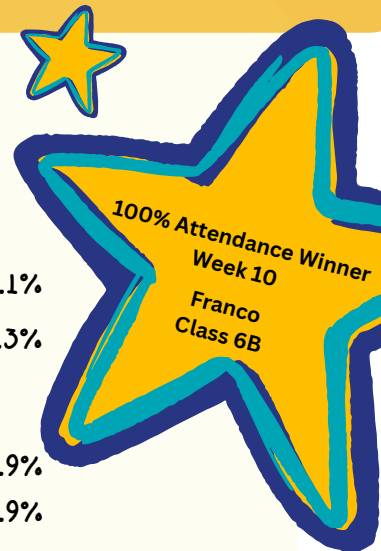
