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

## Class OE & OS

### Class 1A & 1M

# Year 2

## Class 2CM & 2S

This week, the children started an exciting new unit in Writing: warning stories! To hook them into the topic, we travelled back in time to 1666 and visited Thomas Farynor's bakery on Pudding Lane — wonderfully played by Oakley! The children enjoyed tasting freshly baked bread and watched as Mr. Farynor forgot to put out the oven fully, beginning The Great Fire of London.

In Design and Technology we learnt what a 'net' is and discussed how architects use these to make mock ups when they begin designing. We loved exploring with the polygon and magnetiles to create our own nets.

In History, the children were fascinated to learn about the different ways people reacted to The Great Fire of London. We had thoughtful discussions about what precious items we would have buried if we had lived at the time. Can your child remember what they would want to save?

## Class 3M & 3S

A busy week in year 3 this week. In maths, We have been working hard on formal multiplication. We have found it tricky but really persevered.

In writing we are now looking carefully at the model text, unpicking similes and actions and reactions to help guide our independent writing.

We loved our visit to the library this week. It was great to see the children engaging with the community, and showing their enthusiasm for reading. The staff were very complimentary of the children's impeccable behaviour.

In design technology this week we have been busy thinking about joining flaps. We had a very creative afternoon looking at this. In history we have been looking at Iron age defence. In PE we have continued to work on our dances and the children loved showing some line dancing skills off.





## Class 4GR & 4SR

We had a wonderful start to the week when we visited the Buddhist Centre in Scarborough on Tuesday. The children really demonstrated how much knowledge they have and asked some really thoughtful questions. Most impressive was their exemplary behaviour and respectfulness. In PE we have been busy creating our spy themed dance, whilst learning about matching and mirroring.

We have had some fantastic sewing completed in Design and Technology, with the children measuring, marking and cutting their vest tops, then finally sewing them together. We had to have a lot of resilience and had to work co-operatively to make progress. It was challenging at times!

We have looked at precise, adventurous vocabulary to enhance our work as we begin to plan and draft our own version of a defeating a monster story.

In Maths we have been tackling number problems that involve multiplication. Some were 2 step problems. The children have worked determinedly to solve them. Well done!

Our Geography topic - 'How Natural Disasters Shape Our World' is progressing. We are learning about earthquakes, what causes them and what the Richter Scale is.






## Class 6B & 60

We have been using watercolours in our Art, inspired by Edward Marsden. We are learning to use a wash background, altering tone carefully to produce a mood. We have painted trees and shadows to understand the source of light in an image and used a focal point to draw in the observer. We will use these techniques next week to start to create our very own piece of art.
