It was a very exciting week for Year 2 with our visit to Scarborough fire station on Tuesday and can we start by saying how proud we were of all the children for their impeccable behaviour and enthusiasm.

We learnt so much about what equipment is used to fight fires and the protective clothing fire fighters need to wear now. We compared this to how fires were fought in the past and shared all our knowledge about The Great Fire of London (they were very impressed!). We were also lucky enough to sit in the fire engine and have a go at shooting the fire hose at a target- it was so much fun! Hopefully the children came home enthused and asked you to check your fire alarms at home work? If you're unsure, call the fire station and they can come and fit one for you!

Thank you to our three parent/grandparent volunteers who were able to join us, your help is so appreciated! And a huge thank you to all the staff at the fire station for allowing us to visit- it is definitely a highlight of our year!



Class 3M & 3S

We have had a very busy week this week. The children have been busy focusing on division in maths as we begin to introduce the formal method and remainders. The children have been so excited by the MTC event this week, showing their competitive skills. Well done it was great to see such enthusiasm.

In writing this week we have started planning our innovation of 'defeating a monster' the children had some great ideas, thinking about trolls, witches, ghosts and monsters. We cannot wait to get writing.

The children came up with some great ideas - Its eyes were glowing like embers in a fire. Its teeth were as sharp as shards of glass. It was a walking mountain. We were impressed!

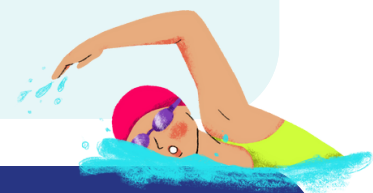
In Maths, we have been looking at improper fractions and mixed numbers. We have persevered as it was quite tricky! We have also done some maths quizzes this week. We have worked really hard.

In RE we have learned about the Sikh kitchen, called the Langar. It serves food to everyone regardless of their faith. We wished that there was a Gurdwara near us so we could go and try some.

Both classes have started their Art topic and analysed the amphoras made by Exekias (a Greek potter and painter) and started their own sketches of the borders and patterns.

They all listened superbly well on Wednesday when author, Ally Sherrick, came in. Class 5S coped amazingly having dance in the classroom due to this.

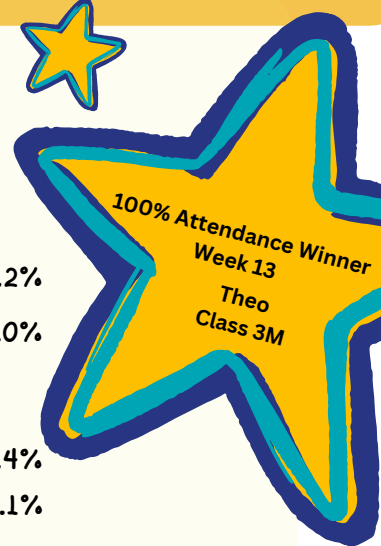

Q: Who inspired you to pursue your dream to be an author?

A: Mum inspired me by reading stories and made them come alive, my dad wrote stories and made funny voices.

Q: What advice would you give to someone who wanted to be a writer?

A: Encourage them to enjoy reading and writing all ways have the 3P's: perseverance, passion, patience! Passion is the most important.

Q: Are there any books that you thought wouldn't be as successful as they were?

A: I gave the publisher time to choose which book he liked most and sometimes they don't pick the book you prefer. We worked together and I listened to advice; it turned out to be surprisingly good.

Q: What was your childhood like?

A: I had a great childhood: I had a sister and we invented loads of games. My mum and dad enjoyed books and I really enjoyed school.

Harry Potter is a mythical and magical fantasy story for children aged 9 - 99 years old.

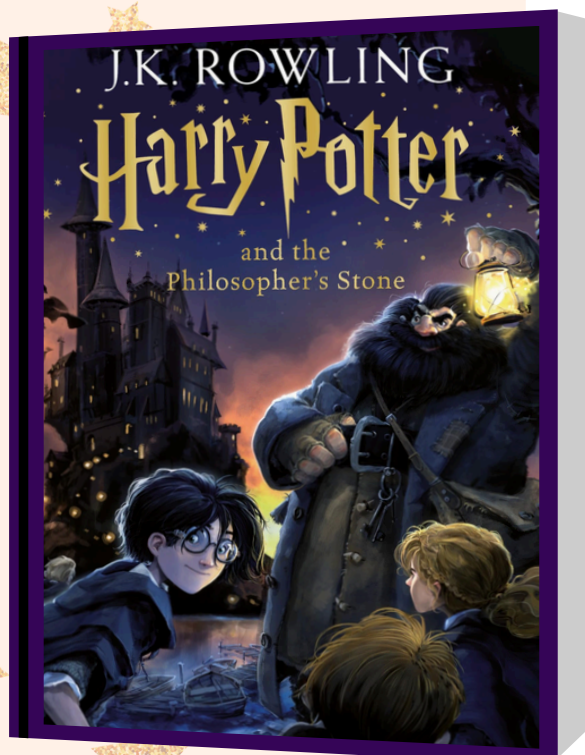
This story is filled with mesmerising highs and terrifying lows; hatreds become friendships with crazy experiences throughout the series.
