## Class 1A & 1TM

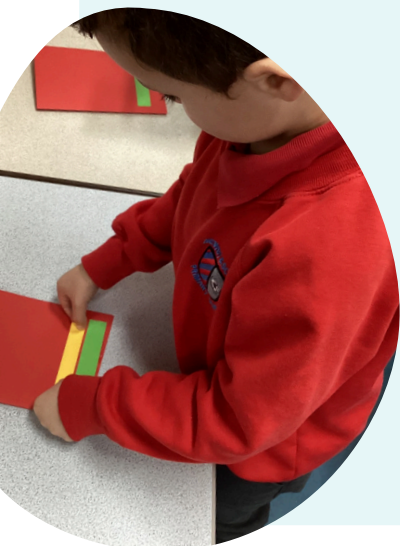
We have had a jam packed last week of term that has been full of the Christmas Spirit.

## Class 3M & 3S

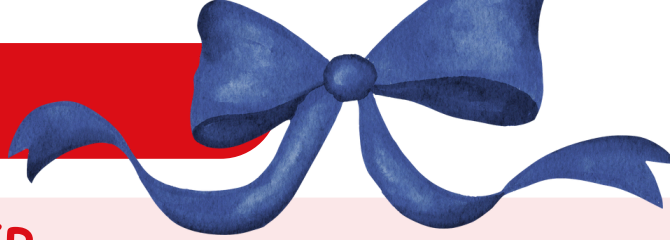

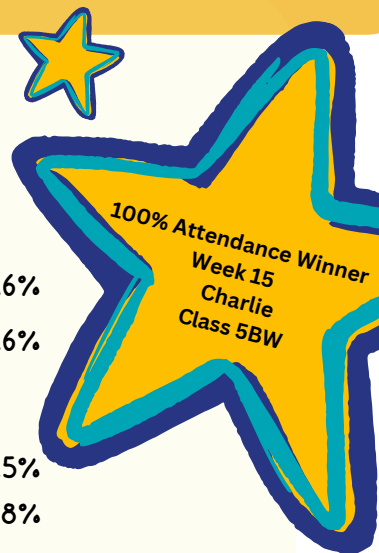

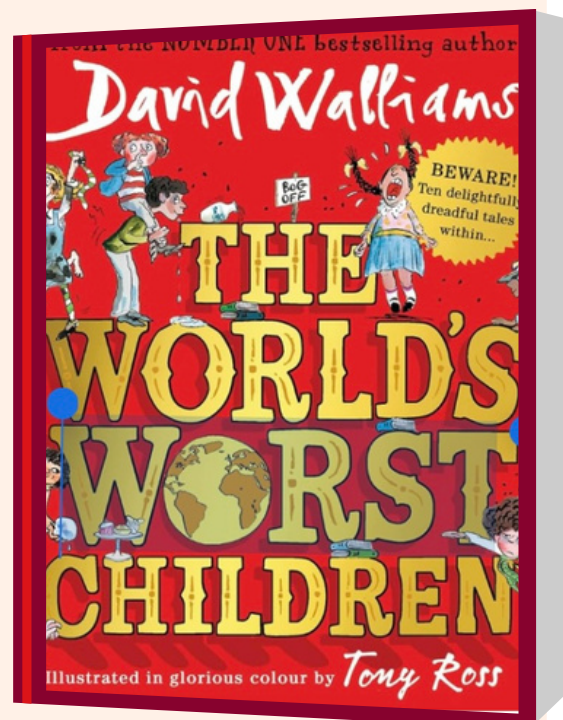
If I could rate this book I would give it a big 6/7! So if you like dribbling, crying and nit rampaging things this book is the one for you.
