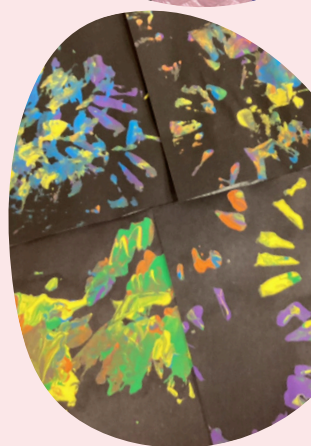
Class OE & OS

Year 1

Class 1A & 1TM

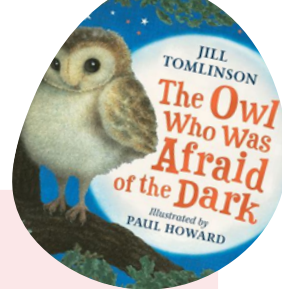
It has been lovely to welcome all the children back after half term and they have all thrown themselves back into their learning.

This term we are introducing History and Design Technology to the children by looking at how transport has changed over time. The children have begun this by thinking about which mode of transport came first and why they think this.

In design technology the children looked at different wheels and used the construction kits to make a model that moved using wheels. They were also introduced to the important person, John Dunlop. Ask your child what he did.

If you want to help take your child's learning further with this topic there is a fantastic free museum in Hull called 'Street Life' which you could visit as a family.





Class 2CM & 2S

It has been a pleasure to welcome all pupils back after half term and we have had another wonderful week in Year 2! We enjoyed listening to Elvis Presley (our musician of the week) and had a go at dancing like him! 😊

In Reading, we have started to explore our new book 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark'. We created a fact file about the author, Jill Tomlinson, and made predictions about what we thought might happen in the story. We are looking forward to reading more!

We started a new unit in RE all about Christianity and learnt about why Jesus' birth was so important to Christians.

We have begun a new unit in maths on multiplication and division. We have started by recognising and making equal groups and using the (x) multiply symbol.

On the last day of the half term, the Year 2 children went on a litter pick around the local area. Mick, from the Keep Scarborough Tidy group, joined them and shared lots of fascinating facts about wildlife and why it's so important not to drop litter. The children worked really hard to make the area cleaner and safer. A member of the public even came over to Class 2CM to say how wonderful it was to see the children helping their community.



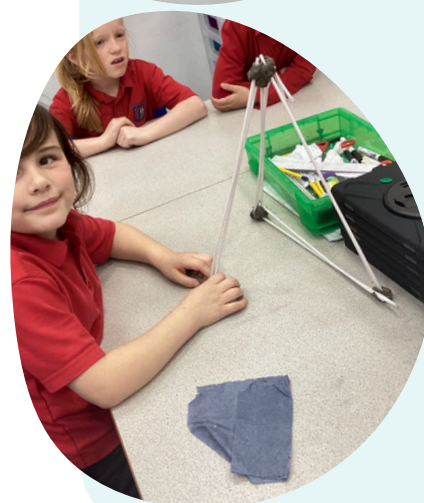
Year 3

Class 3M & 3S

It was great to welcome back the children for another busy half term. They returned with great attitudes, and we have hit the ground running.

In Maths, we have been looking at multiplication using repeated addition to help us. In writing we are writing an explanation text about how to walk through a magical forest.

We started our first design and technology lesson this week looking at structures of buildings and how they use steel beams to support. In history we are now looking at the iron age. We loved our dance lessons in PE, thinking about dancing like a machine would function. In science we are looking at the how the skeleton supports the body.





Class 4GR & 4SR

It was lovely to see the children back after what we hope was a fun and restful half-term.

We have started our unit on multiplication in Maths and this week the children have been using place value charts to multiply numbers by 10 and 100.

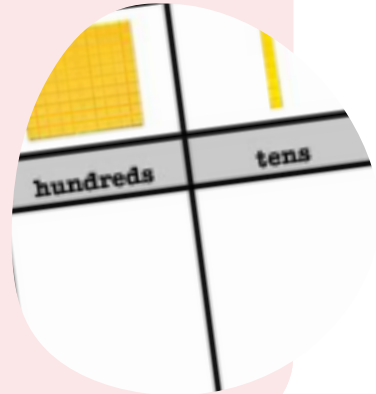
In Writing, the children have started to write a newspaper recount of a film clip, ensuring that the 5ws (who, what, where, when, why) are answered in the first paragraph to make us want to read on!

We have had some great success in sewing as part of our Design and Technology work, with many of the children mastering pleats and gathering whilst really working on their resilience.

Class 5BW & 5S

What a great start back to our half term Year 5!

In our Reading lessons we have found chapter 16 of Who Let The God's Out highly amusing! Aphrodite fired her love taser at Colin and Millicent Tronglebom. Maz Evans, the author, made us laugh with her funny descriptions of them falling in love!

In Maths, we have been learning properties of number (and built cubes to prove that $3 \times 3 \times 3 = 27$). We have then been learning how to multiply and divide any number by 10, 100 and 1000. We are getting really good at it. We practised some 2 step problem solving whilst multiplying by 100 and 1000.

In writing we have been looking at some whacky inventions and ideas. We liked the toaster, run by a fire-eating dragon and the frog who burps bubbles into fizzy pop. We had a go at writing our own explanation text about how polar bears bring ice from the Arctic to keep our fridges cold. We have been learning how to read 6 digit grid references in Geography. We have been practising our skills with maps and atlases.

Our new PE topics are fitness and swimming (for 5BW) and gymnastics and dance (for 5S). We practiced symmetric balances in gymnastics.





Class 6B & 60

Year 6 have had a fantastic first week back after half term - well done for hitting the ground running. We have started our new writing unit, a non-chronological report about a fictional creature. The children are loving exploring technical vocabulary and playing with sentence structures. In reading we have continued Black Powder, with our main character, Tom, arriving in London. It is very tense, with danger at every corner. We have studied how the author, Ally Sherrick, has used figurative language to describe the setting.

We have also planned an experiment about how exercise changes our bodies in science and have started to learn about fractions in maths - finding equivalents and adding and subtracting fractions. Finally, we went on a trip to the church to celebrate Remembrance Day this week - we learned about the Scarborough bombing and enjoyed some snacks.

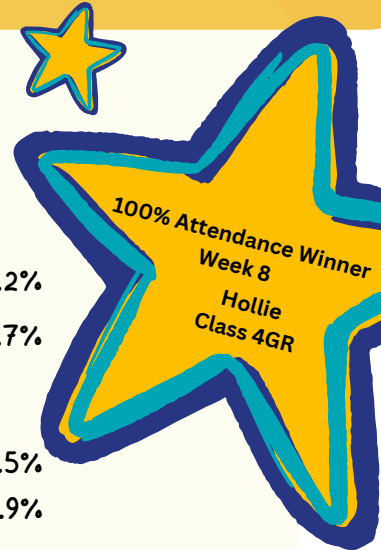
